

# Oklahoma Ag in the Classroom

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 1 14- by 8-inch piece of unbleached muslin</li><li>• 2 3- by 9-inch fabric scraps</li><li>• 1 6- by 4- by 4-inch x fabric triangle</li></ul>	<p><b>Prairie Doll</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Measure and rip muslin into a rectangle.</li><li>2. Measure and mark 16 1/2-inch increments along the length of the muslin</li><li>3. Rip 16 1/2-inch strips</li><li>4. Fold 15 of the strips in half, and use one strip to tie off a doll's head. The tie also serves as arms.</li><li>5. Cut a 1/2-inch hole in the center of each of the two scraps, and place over the head of the doll.</li><li>6. Tie the arms on top of both layers of the dress in the front.</li><li>7. Use your imagination to trim your dress, or make a heart cutout on the top layer.</li><li>8. Tie on the triangle as a bonnet.</li></ol>
